Ponder this question on November 2, Deviled Egg Day: Who put the devil in deviled eggs? The first known printed use of the word "deviled" to describe this dish was in 1786. Why such a fiery term? The yolk of a hard-boiled egg was often mixed with spicy mustard, giving it a hot and devilish taste on the tongue.

Spicy eggs were first eaten in Ancient Rome. The Romans conquered part of southern Spain called Andalusia, and people here often ate eggs with spicy sauces on top of them.

Today, deviled eggs can be quite a delicacy, and they are spiced up with a variety of ingredients such as horseradish, wasabi, garlic, chipotle chilies, cayenne pepper, or salsa. When it comes to the perfect recipe, it seems that the devil is in the details.
